According to the increasing need for masks, some handicraft artists of Golestan province decided to produce masks which are decorated with traditional needlework and embroidery of the province.

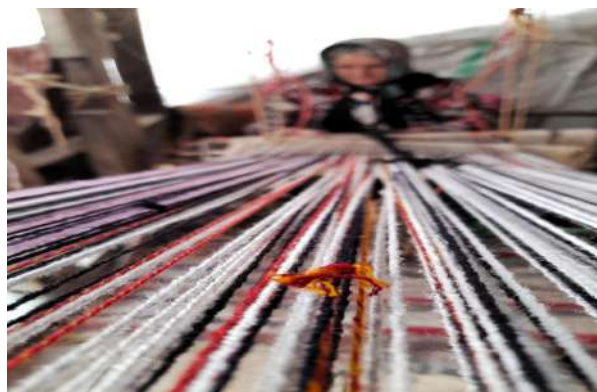
